The H1N1 Swine Flu virus continues to cause illness in Florida and in other areas around the world. This site provides information to prevent illness, recognize the symptoms, and much more.

Florida counties began receiving vaccine shipments the week of October 5th. The initial shipment totaled over 102,000 doses and included the FluMist nasal spray only. The nasal spray:

- Is effective for healthy people 2-49 years of age who are not pregnant, and healthy persons who live with or care for those in a high risk group. The one exception is healthy persons who care for persons with a severely weakened immune system.
- Is not recommended for infants under 2, adults over 49, pregnant women or anyone with a range of underlying health problems.

The injectable vaccine is now arriving throughout the state, with more to be shipped in the coming weeks. The injectable vaccine:

- Is recommended for pregnant women, people who live with or care for infants younger than 6 months of age, health care and emergency medical personnel, anyone from 6 months through 24 years of age, anyone from 25 through 64 years of age with certain chronic medical conditions or a weakened immune system. As more vaccine becomes available, the following groups should consider vaccination: healthy 25 through 64 years old, adults 65 years and older.
- Is not recommended if you have a severe (life-threatening) allergy to eggs, or to any other substance in the vaccine. Also, talk with your health-care provider if you have had a life-threatening allergic reaction after a dose of seasonal flu vaccine, or Guillain Barré Syndrome (a severe paralytic illness also called GBS).
